CARDBOARD BOAT RACE

Master of Ceremonies - Chip Kaczynski (by default)

Saturday, September 1st, 5:00pm, at the beach. Let your creative juices flow and start building that cardboard masterpiece now!

Only TWO (2) materials may be used to construct the hull:

- 1) Corrugated cardboard
- 2) Duct tape, colored tapes are preferred (by the judges)

Event Categories:

- Learner's Permit (Child/children plus one adult)
 Rock-A-Bye-Baby (Children age 8 and under) sailing alone
 Pre-Teen (Children age 9-12) sailing alone
 Know it All (Teenager), sailing alone
- 5. Theoretically Mature (any age)

Additional Awards:

- 1. Most creative or well-decorated
- 2. Battleship best built for seaworthiness
- 3. Aircraft Carrier largest craft
- 4. Good Try Better luck next year
- 5. Titanic Most dramatic sinking

Official Rules:

1. The entire **boat** must be built from cardboard & duct tape only.

2. All forms of decoration are encouraged so long as they don't improve the structural integrity or seaworthiness of the hull of the boat.

3. A boat must be crewed by at least one AYC family member.

4. Paddles and/or oars are permitted. Motors are not permitted.

5. Life jackets MUST be worn by all participants.

6. Each boat (and all crew) will start at a point determined by the Master of Ceremonies. The boat and all crew shall race a course set by the MC, and shall not be Olympic Course.

7. Removal of all cardboard / boat debris from the race area is the responsibility of the participants. (Failure to do so will result in disqualification)

*Cooperate and Graduate. "If ya ain't cheatin' – ya ain't tryin" Life ain't fair...

*All decisions by judges are final. By entering this race you agree to hold harmless all race officials and judges; waive your rights to a protest committee hearing, appeal, and/or jury trial.

*Participants who fail to follow the rules will be forced to walk the plank (or join the Board).
