Notice of Race

1 Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in the current version of *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2 Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available by October 29th online at <https://www.atlantayachtclub.org/no-more-turkey>.

3 Communication

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at <https://www.atlantayachtclub.org/no-more-turkey>.

4 Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Laser / ILCA class.
4.2 All Laser / ILCA rigs are allowed. A minimum of three entries of the same rig constitutes a separate fleet.
4.3 Class legal sails are not required.
4.4 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form and submitting it, together with the required fee by end of day Thursday, November 3rd.
4.5 Boats may enter the event by registering online <https://www.atlantayachtclub.org/no-more-turkey>.
4.6 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5 Fees

- 5.1 The entry fee is \$25 per boat for adults, \$20 per boat for juniors. Saturday dinner and Sunday lunch are included in the registration fee.
5.2 Non-sailors are welcome to join for the Saturday dinner (\$10) and/or Sunday lunch (\$5). Please register online.
5.3 Online payment and credit card options are available and encouraged.

6 Schedule

- 6.1 Saturday, November 5 (Eastern *Daylight* Time)

0930 Registration open in the clubhouse
1030 Registration closed
1100 Competitors Meeting at the Point Viewing Pavilion
Lunch (on your own, not provided)
1157 Warning signal for first race.
More races to follow. We will try for six races on Saturday. No races will start after 1600.

1830 Italian dinner with lasagna, spaghetti & meatballs, bread, and salad!

6.2 Sunday, November 6 (Eastern **Standard** Time)

0857 Warning signal for first race.
More races to follow. We will try for three races on Sunday. No races will start after 1200.

After races on Sunday, awards will be presented and lunch served in the clubhouse (approximately 45 minutes after the last race).

7 Scoring

7.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

7.2 If 5 or more races are completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. If less than 5 races are completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores (no throw-outs).

8 Acceptance of Risk, Waiver of Liability, and Indemnification

8.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' Participants in this regatta acknowledge by their participation that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. Such risks include but are not limited to those created by strong winds, rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of injury, including permanent, catastrophic injury, or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, collision, or other causes. As a condition of their participation in this regatta, each participant expressly accepts the risks associated with participation and releases all claims they may have against the Atlanta Yacht Club and Laser Fleet 116 and the officers, directors, members, committees and employees ("Released Parties") for property damage, personal injury or death, or any other basis arising at or in the vicinity of the host facility before, during, or after the races. In addition, each participant accepts responsibility for damage or injury caused by their breach of *The Racing Rules of Sailing* or applicable governmental rules for the avoidance of collision and agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Released Parties from and against any claims which may arise from participant's negligence or intentional acts.

9 Prizes

9.1 Prizes will be given as follows:

- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes for each fleet consisting of 7 or more boats, or
- 1st and 2nd place prizes for each fleet consisting of 4 – 6 boats, or
- 1st place prize for each fleet consisting of 3 boats

10 Additional Information

10.1 All Sailors shall be required to wear a Coast Guard approved life jacket while on the water.

10.2 Wet/dry suits are strongly recommended due to potential cold temperatures in November on Lake Allatoona.

10.3 AYC is 17 miles north of Atlanta. Take Exit 277 (Ga HWY 92) off I-75. Go east on Hwy 92 and turn left onto Hunt Rd. Go .2 miles, through Stop sign and immediately bear right through hairpin turn; the road changes to Kellogg Creek Rd. Go 1 mile and turn left onto Yacht Club Drive. Look for entrance to AYC on the right after one mile.

10.4 Club Gate code will be set to 1105# for the weekend.

10.5 AYC prohibits pets, firearms, and motorcycles on club premises.

10.6 It is the responsibility of AYC members/guests to take appropriate measures to safeguard their personal property while on club premises.

10.7 Camping and showers are available free at AYC.

10.8 Hotels are just 5 minutes away located at I-75 and Highway 92.
